

#### Introduction

This document shows how Interactive Music powered by Silver Burdett™ with Alfred, meets the *Idaho Content Standards Humanities: Music (2008).* Correlation references are to the Teacher Notes and are cited by the title of the lesson or activity where the matching instruction is found. 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#### **Standard 1**: Historical and Cultural Contexts
